Scheduled air seat capacity will increase 9.0% in 2018, leading to another record year of visitor arrivals in 2018


Most economies in the world will have steady growth this year, U.S. growth rate will be better than last year







## For job count, and as of the beginning of 2016, all the counties were fully recovered From Great Recession (% recovery from January 2008)




#### **Big Island and Kauai are still adjusting**





### Value of private construction permits decreased in 2017

















#### Hawaii Median Condominium Prices





### Hawaii Jobs by Industry: 2016




