

#### Passengers:







- 11 Interisland routes, including turboprop flights serving Moloka'i, Lāna'i and Kapalua.
- Interisland freighter service (launched Aug. 1)

#### Fleet:

- 24 Airbus A330s
- 8 Airbus A321neos (18 by 2020)
- 8 Boeing 767-300 (retiring by 1Q 2019)
- 20 Boeing 717-200s
- 4 ATR-42s
- 2 ATR-72s (5 by 2019)
- 10 Boeing 787s on order


We have established a strong presence in all key international markets over the last 7 years


**HA Share of Total Daily Seats to HI**


